### "She the North!"

This week we celebrated the wonderful victory of Canadian Teen - Bianca Andreescu in the US Open. A proud moment for Torontonians and indeed, all Canadians!



Students reflected on Bianca's maturity, humility and respect under pressure - markers of a true champion. CWSA students were reminded that how you win is just as important as winning. I asked each of them to always treat others with respect while aiming high.

That Bianca unseated - Serena Williams such an accomplished athlete - at 19 years old is incredible! As Bianca continues to make her debut on the world stage, we will learn more about what motivates her love of tennis. One thing, however, is clear. Bianca has been working hard. She has worked on her skills in the game but also on skills of the mind including her behaviour and attitude.

Over the week we also explored Serena's humble beginnings - she was not born to wealth, grew up in a tough neighbourhood, and yet she would excel in spite of her challenges. Serena's example demonstrates that an enabling mindset, with hard work can be far more powerful than environmental contexts in our journey to succeed. Whatever challenges we face can be overcome with the right supports.

We reflected on the commonalities shared by the women. Both champions using their voices to advance women in sport. In an interview on The National, Bianca Andreescu, clad in a T-shirt bearing the word Equality, told the interviewer that she would like to continue the fight for pay equity for female athletes who currently earn substantially less than their male counterparts. It was Serena Williams who years earlier also drew attention to the differential pay for women in sport when she became the first women to make the Forbes 100 list of top paid athletes. Bianca and Serena are two great women who have, and are making their mark in sport and raising their voices strongly through word and deed for not only women in sport, but all women.

Thursday we recognized our privileges and benefits. We are in a school of tremendous resources in a prosperous city and country. In our reflections, I asked students to be thankful for their good fortune but to guard against becoming complacent. Just like Bianca Andreescu and Serena Williams, we can all be agents of change - breaking barriers and using our voices and deeds to challenge injustices. We can all support social justice issues we notice locally and globally. We can all use our voices to advocate for issues we see as inequitable or raise our voices in support of others. We can open doors for others around us and make our society more accessible for all. Throughout the week perhaps your child began to voice their reflections on current issues and events that have now come to their attention. Perhaps they even began questioning what might be done.

This week marked the first televised National Leaders Debate. These debates provide a quick introduction to many of the issues facing our country and are a wonderful learning opportunity to hear interpretations of the issues facing our country. As we anticipate the coming election, their continues to be rich opportunities for learning beyond the classroom.

### **Boomerang Lunch**

Lunch Containers – Please consider purchasing reusable plastic lunch containers as opposed to glass jars. We had a glass jar break this week and glass shards pose a safety risk for students.

To assist in creating a safer and cleaner environment we are implementing a new waste management system – **Boomerang Lunch**. What does this mean? As a CWSA community we are asking students and families to pack a llitterless lunch to school and to **bring back** unfinished food (wrappers, leftovers, juice box containers etc.). At home you and you child(ren) can sort – recycle and compost the waste. This gives parents a true window into what their children are consuming at school and also provides a structured learning opportunity at home. We ask you support John and Monica our Lunch Supervisors , as we try a new way to manage waste and create a cleaner environment for our students with health and environmental sensitivities.
