



We want to send out a friendly reminder students and families may now arrange to safely pick up items they left at school and return items that belong to the TDSB on from June 25-29, The school will be open 8:00 am to 3:00pm. We will need to screen all students before they head up to the classrooms. Students are expected to return any TDSB technology, along with school items including instruments, textbooks, school library books, and anything else that is property of the Board.

Guidelines for Visit

- Visits to the school must be conducted within the Public Health Guidelines and will include; physical
 distancing, single entry/exit point and use of hand sanitization. Further, self screen (TDSB App/Form) must be
 conducted prior to entering the building.
- Ensure you know your child's homeroom, teacher's name
- No additional family members, particularly children, will be allowed to enter the building
- No access to washrooms or drinking fountains
- If your child has medication at the school, it will be bagged, labeled and available for pick up at the office.
- Desks, lockers (some students still have locks on lockers from previous year) and any other individual spaces must be cleared out.

June is Portuguese Speaking Heritage Month

TDSB is proud to recognize Portuguese Speaking Heritage Month during the month of June celebrating these rich and vibrant cultures. The contributions of the Portuguese-speaking community to Canada's history are vast as include the arts, sports, medicine and public life.

Did you know?

- 250 million Portuguese speakers worldwide, making it the fifth-most spoken language
- Over 1,400 TDSB students speak Portuguese as their mother tongue or as a primary language
- Portuguese is the official language of eight countries: Angola, Brazil, Cape Verde, Guinea-Bissau,
 Mozambique, Portugal, Sao Time & Principe and East Timor
- While the Archipelago of the Azores and the Archipelago of Madeira are a part of Portugal, they are simultaneously Autonomous regions which share in the Portuguese language
- As well, due to historic ties, various regions of the world including Macau, China and Goa and Damao, India, celebrate their Portuguese influence
